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WHAT IS PROPOSED?

The Greenport Board of Education unanimously approved a Capital Improvement bond referendum in the amount of \$23.87 million. The bond will make critical repairs, renovate our educational program with state of the art improvements, and provide school safety and security enhancements.

WHY NOW?

Repairing and improving our school preserves the community's investment in a building that is over 86 years old. Making necessary structural repairs and providing our children with enhanced educational experiences lays the groundwork for a healthy, safe and vibrant school; a healthy, safe and vibrant Greenport. In addition, **interest rates are low; investing today will mean future savings.**

WHAT WILL IT COST?

The cost of the Bond will vary for residents, businesses, and agricultural properties. The chart below illustrates approximate cost based on property value.
