Committee on Special Education

Greenport UFSD provides special education services and programs to students with disabilities pursuant to applicable federal and state laws. Any parent or person in parental relation who suspects that their child has a disability may refer the child for an evaluation by the district's Committee on Special Education (CSE) for eligibility for special education services and programs. More detailed information on this process is available in *A Parent's Guide to Special Education*, which is published on the New York State Education Department's website in English and Spanish.

Parents and persons in parental relation should contact the district's Office of Special Education if they suspect that their child has a disability. Please contact Mr. Tsaveras or Mrs. Artukmac at (631) 477 - 1950 ext. 1211.

Child Find

Child Find refers to the process of locating, identifying, and evaluating children and youth who may be eligible for special education services designed to meet their educational needs at no cost to families. Children and youth, ages birth to 21, living in the Greenport UFSD, who are suspected of having a disability may be referred for a possible evaluation to determine if they are eligible for special education services. This includes children and youth who are experiencing homelessness, highly mobile, migrant, wards of the state and children and youth attending private schools located within Greenport UFSD boundaries regardless of where they reside. All other children must live in the Greenport UFSD attendance area.

Counseling & Guidance

The Counseling (Guidance) Department helps students discover and develop their individual abilities, interests, and educational/career goals. They also refer students for help when personal, social-emotional issues arise. The school psychologist plays a role in prevention, intervention, and remediation services. The psychologist helps identify and evaluate children with emotional, social, behavioral, and learning disorders, provide short-term or group counseling, and serve as a resource to staff and parents in working with children with special needs.

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973

The Greenport UFSD hereby gives notice that it does not discriminate on the basis of handicap in violation of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. The district further gives notice that it does not discriminate on the basis of disability in admission or access to its programs and activities, including vocational programs. No person shall be denied employment solely because of any physical, mental, or medical impairment, which is unrelated to the person's ability to engage in the activities on the job for which application has been made. The secondary vocational education opportunities available to district residents under age 21 are referred to in the handbook and curriculum guides prepared by the high school.

Child Photograph and Video Permission

During the course of the school year, photographs and video footage of students are taken for use in school district publications, as well as coverage by the local and regional print, radio, and TV press of school district activities and events. Students are also, when appropriate to the use of the photograph or video footage, identified by name. Parental permission is assumed unless Greenport UFSD is contacted in writing by Oct 1st. Submit your request to either the Elementary Office or High School Office.

Reporting to Parents

Progress reports and report cards for secondary students are distributed four times a year. Elementary student report cards are distributed four times a year. Parent/Teacher conferences are held in the Fall and Spring. Parents are urged to log on to the district's parent portal on eSchool to review their child's progress, attendance, and assignments regularly. Parents are also encouraged to email or call their child's teacher when they have questions concerning their child's progress.

Dignity for All Students Act

New York State enacted legislation effective July 1, 2012, titled The Dignity for All Students Act (DASA). DASA seeks to provide the State's public elementary and secondary school students with a safe and supportive environment free from discrimination, intimidation, taunting, harassment, and bullying on school property, a school bus and/or at a school function.

To provide assistance with The Dignity for All Students Act, the BOE has designated each building principal as the DASA coordinator. DASA coordinators serve as the information source and liaison for each building with regard to the legislation. Please find their contact information below:

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law that affords parents the right to have access to their children's education records, the right to seek to have the records amended, and the right to have some control over the disclosure of personally identifiable information from the education records. When a student turns 18 years old, or enters a postsecondary institution at any age, the rights under FERPA transfer from the parents to the student ("eligible student"). The following information is designated as student "Directory Information": the student's name, address, telephone number, date of birth, place of birth, major course of study, participation in school activities or sports, weight and height if a member of an athletic team, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, most recent school attended, class schedule, photograph, e-mail address, and class roster. "Directory Information" may be disclosed without prior written consent. Parents or eligible students will have two weeks from the beginning of the school year or date a student enrolls to advise the school district, in writing, of any and all items they refuse the district to designate as directory information for the balance of the school year.

PÁGINA DE POLÍTICA

Comité de Educación Especial

Greenport UFSD brinda servicios y programas de educación especial a estudiantes con discapacidades de conformidad con las leyes federales y estatales aplicables. Cualquier padre o persona en relación de paternidad que sospeche que su hijo tiene una discapacidad puede referir al niño para una evaluación por parte del Comité de Educación Especial (CSE) del distrito para determinar su elegibilidad para servicios y programas de educación especial. Hay información más detallada sobre este proceso disponible en la Guía de Educación Especial para Padres, que se publica en el sitio web del Departamento de Educación del Estado de Nueva York en Inglés y Español.

Los padres y las personas con parentesco deben comunicarse con la Oficina de Educación Especial del distrito si sospechan que su hijo tiene una discapacidad. Comuníquese con el Sr. Tsaveras o la Sra. Artukmac al (631) 477 - 1950 ext. 1211.

Child Find

Child Find se refiere al proceso de encontrar, identificar y evaluar a los niños y jóvenes que pueden ser elegibles para los servicios de educación especial diseñados para satisfacer sus necesidades educativas sin costo para las familias. Los niños y jóvenes, desde nacimiento hasta los 21 años, que viven dentro de la zona de Greenport UFSD y que se sospecha que padecen una discapacidad pueden ser referidos para una posible evaluación para determinar si son elegibles para los servicios de educación especial. Esto incluye a niños y jóvenes sin hogar, que se mudan mucho de hogar, que son migrantes, que estén bajo tutela del estado; así como niños y jóvenes que asisten a escuelas privadas ubicadas dentro de los límites de Greenport UFSD, independientemente de donde residan. Todos los demás niños deben vivir en el área de asistencia del GUFSD.

Consejería y Orientación

El Departamento de Consejería (Orientación) ayuda a los estudiantes a descubrir y desarrollar sus habilidades, intereses y metas educativas/profesionales individuales. También refieren a los estudiantes para que los ayuden cuando ocurren problemas personales o socio-emocionales. La psicóloga escolar juega un papel en los servicios de prevención, intervención y remediación. La psicóloga ayuda a identificar y evaluar a los niños con trastornos emocionales, sociales, conductuales y de aprendizaje, brindan asesoramiento a corto plazo o grupal y sirven como recurso para el personal y los padres en el trabajo con niños con necesidades especiales.

Sección 504 de la Ley de Rehabilitación de 1973

El Greenport UFSD por la presente notifica que no discrimina por discapacidad en violación de la Sección 504 de la Ley de Rehabilitación de 1973. El distrito también notifica que no discrimina por discapacidad en la admisión o el acceso a sus programas, y actividades, incluyendo programas vocacionales. A ninguna persona se le negará el empleo únicamente debido a cualquier impedimento físico, mental o médico, que no esté relacionado con la capacidad de la persona para participar en las actividades en el trabajo para el cual se presentó la solicitud. Las oportunidades de educación vocacional secundaria disponibles para los residentes del distrito menores de 21 años están referenciadas en el manual y guías curriculares de la escuela secundaria.

Permiso de uso de fotografía y videos de niños

Durante el transcurso del año escolar, se toman fotografías y videos de los estudiantes para su uso en las publicaciones del distrito escolar, así como también para la cobertura de actividades y eventos del distrito escolar en la prensa escrita, radial y televisiva local y regional. Los estudiantes también son, cuando es apropiado para el uso de fotografías o videos, identificados por su nombre. Se asume el permiso de los padres a menos que se contacte a Greenport UFSD por escrito antes del 1ro de Octubre. Envíe su solicitud a la Oficina de Primaria o a la Oficina de la Escuela Secundaria.

Informes a los padres

Los informes de progreso y boletas de calificaciones para los estudiantes de secundaria se distribuyen cuatro veces al año. Las boletas de calificaciones de los estudiantes de primaria se distribuyen cuatro veces al año. Las conferencias de padres y maestros se llevan a cabo en otoño y primavera. Se aconseja a los padres iniciar sesión en el portal de padres del distrito en eSchool para revisar el progreso, la asistencia y las tareas de sus hijos con regularidad. También se aconseja a los padres enviar un correo electrónico o llamar al maestro de su hijo cuando tengan preguntas sobre el progreso de su hijo.

Ley de Dignidad para todos los Estudiantes

El estado de Nueva York promulgó una legislación a partir del 1ro de Julio de 2012, titulada Ley de Dignidad para Todos los Estudiantes (DASA). DASA busca brindar a los estudiantes de escuelas primarias y secundarias públicas del estado un entorno seguro y de apoyo libre de discriminación, intimidación, burlas, acoso y acoso en la propiedad escolar, un autobús escolar y/o en una función escolar.

Para brindar asistencia con la Ley de Dignidad para Todos los Estudiantes, la BOE ha designado a cada director de edificio como coordinador de DASA. Ley de Privacidad y Derechos Educativos de la Familia

La Ley de privacidad y derechos educativos de la familia (FERPA) es una ley federal que otorga a los padres el derecho a tener acceso a los registros educativos de sus hijos, el derecho a buscar que se modifiquen los registros y el derecho a tener cierto control sobre la divulgación de información personal. Información identificable de los registros educativos. Cuando un estudiante cumple 18 años o ingresa a una institución postsecundaria a cualquier edad, los derechos bajo FERPA se transfieren de los padres al estudiante ("estudiante elegible"). La siguiente información se designa como "Información de directorio" del estudiante: el nombre del estudiante, dirección, número de teléfono, fecha de nacimiento, lugar de nacimiento, curso principal de estudio, participación en actividades escolares o deportes, peso y altura si es miembro de un equipo atlético. equipo, fechas de asistencia, títulos y premios recibidos, escuela a la que asistió más recientemente, horario de clases, fotografía, dirección de correo electrónico y lista de clases. La "información del directorio" se puede divulgar sin el consentimiento previo por escrito. Los padres o estudiantes elegibles tendrán dos semanas a partir del comienzo del año escolar o la fecha en que se inscriba un estudiante para informar al distrito escolar, por escrito, sobre todos y cada uno de los elementos que se nieguen a que el distrito designe como información de directorio para el resto del año escolar.
